





1. How did this "Youth Exchange' meet your expectations since the Midterm Evaluation until now? (1 = Not at all 6 = Yes completely)







## Why?


For get to know people better and the communication gets easier and deeper. To form human beings capable of understanding each other and search for coincidences and accept differences.


I would have like to share some workshops with local kids. Maybe some learning activities especially prepared for the occasion regarding communication with language barriers.

I wish we discussed the topic about culture and youth between ourselves and not just the presentation in University.






